



Erasmus Traineeship & Exchange Extra EU

Universities holding an Erasmus charter for Higher Education (ECHE) that have a partnership with UNIMIB through a specific **Erasmus Inter-Institutional Agreement.**

Universities that have a partnership with UNIMIB through a specific **Double Degree Agreement**

Students can choose their destination - and it is their responsibility to make the necessary contacts and arrangements – among the following Institutions:

- Universities:
- Public and private companies, including bodies in the field of Education and training/vocational training, national and local public entities; trade unions, chambers of commerce; research laboratories; non-governmental organizations, etc.

Please note: The following destinations are <u>not</u> eligible for traineeship: EU institutions and other EU bodies; organisations managing EU programmes, such as National Agencies

Eligible activities

Erasmus Study

• Erasmus for study is meant to carry out the didactic activities included in the degree course Didactic Regulations: typically exams, but also a period of curricular internship and/or thesis research, *provided the host University is available to accept these options*

- Internship in public or private bodies;
- Internship in hospital;
- Medical and/or Surgical clerkship(s) for the Italian Medical Licensure,
- Internship in a public or private research laboratory;
- Practical training (students/postgraduates);
- Assistantship for future teachers and PhDs;
- Internship as preparatory work for the experimental thesis;
- Practical Assessment Traineeships (PAT) in medical and surgical areas (previous authorization by Coordinator);
- Professional training for admission to the State Examination for Psychologists (previous authorization by Coordinator required)

Erasmus Traineeship

Eligible activities

Exchange Extra EU

- Master thesis / experimental thesis;
- PhD thesis;
- Internship, practical training, Medical and/or Surgical clerkship(s) for the Italian Medical Licensure, assistantship (<u>excluding</u> <u>postgraduate</u>);
- Attendance to courses and relevant examinations (only for specific destinations and specific degree courses under a framework agreement for cooperation and research)

Double Degree EU & extra EU

 Attendance to courses + exams of the second year of Master degree



Pre-requisites to apply

- □ Students must be enrolled **full-time** within the **normal duration of the course of study** («in corso») to a Degree Course, Master's Degree or Single-cycle Master's Degree, to a School of Specialization or to a PhD. Part-time students and students with a suspended or interrupted career cannot be admitted
- □ Students cannot benefit from other grants funded by the European Union for the same period of time (e.g. Marie Sklodowska Curie grant, EIT Raw Materials funds, etc.).

The above requirements have effect from the application to the end of the mobility programme



Programmes' duration

Erasmus Study

- Minimum 2 months spent abroad (a complete academic period of at least 62 days) – Maximum 12 months (360 days);
- Minimum 3 months spent abroad (90 days) for PhD and Specialization students.
- The minimum duration implies an **uninterrupted** stay at the host Institution

- Minimum 2 months spent abroad (a complete academic period of at least 62 days) – Maximum 12 months (360 days);
- Minimum 3 months spent abroad (90 days) for PhD and Specialization students.
- The minimum duration implies an **uninterrupted** stay at the host Institution
- Post-graduate mobilities must comply with specific regulations imposed by Regional authorities and/or Professional Associations/Registers

Programmes' duration

Exchange Extra EU

- Minimum 30 actual days spent abroad Maximum 6 continuous months, possibly renewable if the mobility is meant for the preparation of the thesis;
- Minimum 3 actual months spent abroad (90 days) for students enrolled in PhD and Specialization courses.
- The minimum duration implies an **uninterrupted** stay at the host Institution

Double Degree
EU & extraEU

 6 to 12 months, according to the duration stipulated in the Double Degree Agreements



Publication of calls - schedule

Erasmus Study

A single call, issued once a year in December, for mobilities to be carried out during the following academic year.

The call 2023/24 for mobilities in the academic year 2024/2025 will be published on 20 December 2023.

Mobilities can be carried out from July 2024 to 30 September 2025.

Programmes' funding

Exchange Extra-EU

- Grants are funded by the Italian Government and UNIMIB;
- Amount is proportional to the cost of living of the host Country;
- UniMiB funding for mobilities in the a.y. 2023/2024 was approved by the University Board of Administration on 18 July 2023.

Double Degree EU & Extra-EU

- EU destinations: grants follow the rules of the Erasmus study call;
- Extra-EU destinations: grants follow the rules of the Exchange Extra-EU call;
- The amount of UniMiB funds for mobilities in the a.y. 2024/2025 will be approved by the University management between July and September 2024



Focus on PhDs

PhD students can apply for all UniMiB mobility calls

Their period abroad has to be of at least 3 consecutive months

The mobility grant can be summed to the doctorate grant additional allowance



Focus on Students with special needs

Students with disability or learning disabilities are encouraged to apply for mobility programmes

Supplementary costs related to the participation in mobility programmes can be reimbursed thanks to additional EU funds



Focus on Post-graduate mobility

Post-graduate mobility can be carried out **ONLY** through the **Erasmus Traineeship** programme

Application must be submitted **before** obtaining the degree

The Traineeship period must be carried out entirely after the degree and completed within one year from graduation

Mobility programmes aimed at *legal practicum, admission to the State Examination* for *Psychologists* and *medical/surgical clerkship* must take place in compliance with the provisions of the relevant Professional Associations



Mobility Coordinators

Mobility Coordinators are the contact persons for all didactic aspects of mobility. They are responsible for:

- □ The evaluation of the students' learning agreement: LA/LAT/LAEX presented before the mobility and any changes made during the mobility;
- ☐ The recognition of didactic/training activities successfully carried out during the mobility (provided such activities do not exceed the ECTS of the study plan);
- □ The evaluation and authorization of period extension requests, whenever necessary to complete the activities approved in the LA/LAT/LAEX.
