■ **01/2025 – Present: The Impact of Climate Change on Sexual and Reproductive Health: The Cases of Brazil, Kenya, and Tanzania**

Leading a multi-country research project, in collaboration with the Research Centre [ARCO](#), aimed at exploring the impact of climate change on women's sexual and reproductive health in Brazil, Kenya and Tanzania. The primary goal is to produce a report to support WeWorld's advocacy activities at COP30, to be held in Brazil in November 2025. The research is based on secondary data analysis from existing sources and other relevant datasets, alongside data collection – both through quantitative and qualitative methods – in close collaboration between researchers and local research teams (community members rather than professional researchers). The project therefore includes participatory activities, including

workshops, training sessions and discussions on the findings, all collaboratively shaped, to inform the final report for COP30.

03/2025 – 05/2025: Sexual and Reproductive Rights and Bodily Autonomy: The Italian Case

The study aims to explore gender differences in the exercise of sexual and reproductive rights in Italy, covering topics such as abortion, contraception, fertility, and the broader scope of bodily autonomy, delving into issues ranging from societal pressures related to aesthetics and motherhood to ageing and menopause. This research has involved a quantitative study, conducted in collaboration with Ipsos, based on a sample of 1,000 Italians aged 18 and over. To enrich the data, the study has incorporated qualitative methods such as interviews and focus groups, involving a total of 15 participants. These qualitative insights allow for a deeper exploration of the themes, providing a more nuanced understanding of how perceptions and experiences differ across gender and age groups. The research contributes valuable insights into the landscape of sexual and reproductive rights and bodily autonomy in Italy, highlighting ongoing challenges and social dynamics that influence individuals' choices, as well as the negotiation practices and agency they can emerge.

Conducting a comprehensive literature review on workplace violence and harassment at a global level, with a specific focus on Italy as well, along with an analysis of the results from an opinion survey conducted in collaboration with Ipsos, based on a representative sample of the Italian population. Furthermore, 140 testimonies of people who experienced harassment, violence and abuse at work in Italy were collected and analysed. The results and analysis were published in the report *“Non staremo al nostro posto. Per un diritto a un lavoro libero da molestie e violenze (We Will Not Stay in Our Place. For the Right to a Workplace Free from Harassment and Violence)”*.

Developing a questionnaire for ChildFund Alliance's survey on the protection, exercise, and violation of rights, as well as the fears, expectations, and future priorities of over 4,000 children from 41 countries worldwide. In addition to quantitative data, the consultation involves collecting personal testimonies to provide deeper insights. The survey results have been integrated into the *“ChildFund Alliance World Index on the Rights of Women and Children”*, a flagship report of ChildFund Alliance - a global network of 11 child-focused humanitarian organisations - that measures the living conditions of women and children in 157 countries worldwide by assessing the implementation of their rights.

Conducting Italy's first quantitative study on menstrual health and period poverty, I designed a comprehensive questionnaire for the WeWorld-Ipsos survey on a representative sample of the population. I also collected and analysed over 300 personal

testimonies related to menstrual and menopause experiences for the creation of the #SeiPassiPer (#SixStepsFor) Manifesto, aimed at promoting menstrual justice in Italy. The results and analyses were integrated into the report, "*enCICLOpedia. Le cose che dovresti sapere sul ciclo mestruale*," initially published in Italian and later translated into English.

Discussing menopause in professional environments remains a taboo: one in three individuals considers it unprofessional, and one in four men believes that menopausal women are unfit for leadership roles. These are among the findings of "*Il corpo politico. Autonomia corporea e menopausa tra potere, resistenza e cura collettiva*", a report that explores the complex intersections between sexual and reproductive rights, ageing, and menopause in the Italian context, through a gendered and intersectional lens. Based on a representative survey of 1,000 people conducted with Ipsos—and enriched by in-depth interviews and focus group discussions—the report examines public perceptions not only around menopause, but also around key issues such as abortion, contraception, and motherhood. By incorporating first-person narratives, the study offers a nuanced and embodied account of how these experiences are lived and politicised, especially for women and gender non-conforming individuals. Through the lens of lived experience and situated knowledge, "*Il corpo politico*" calls for a rethinking of care, power, and justice—one that affirms bodily autonomy and recognises the dignity and diversity of all bodies, across age, gender identity, and reproductive status.

The WeWorld Index Italy 2025 provides a clear analysis of the living conditions of women and minors in Italy, focusing on the implementation and violations of their rights in key areas such as education, health, economy, society, environment, and culture. In its fourth edition, the Index is the result of aggregating data into three sub-indices – Context, Minors, and Women – covering 15 dimensions and 30 indicators. The report ranks Italy's 21 regions on a scale from 0 to 100, highlighting regional disparities. This edition also focuses on a crucial question: How can we build a truly families-friendly country, where every type of family is considered and supported? To answer this, the report examines cultural and demographic changes in family life, the welfare state, and work-life balance policies. In this context, the report also presents exclusive findings from a WeWorld-Ipsos survey, conducted in 2024 with 1,100 workers aged between 20 and 64. The survey explores the impact of the labour market on work-life balance and persistent gender inequalities.

The report explores the main regulations on workplace harassment and violence, emphasising how these acts constitute a violation of the human right to safe and dignified work— a right that is too often infringed upon, particularly for vulnerable groups such as women and younger individuals. Women are more exposed to specific forms of violence, including sexual and psychological harassment, as well as bullying, all of which are deeply intertwined with gender inequalities, power dynamics, and organizational hierarchies. The research then focuses on Italy, presenting new data gathered from the opinion survey conducted by WeWorld and Ipsos, providing a concrete and current view of the phenomenon. This includes 140 testimonies from individuals across different social contexts, confirming the structural nature of the problem.

This publication presents the results of an ethnographic study conducted in 2022 in Italy, within healthcare facilities and clinics specialised in assisted reproduction. The research focuses on a specific perspective: the viewpoint of healthcare professionals involved in reproductive assistance. Therefore, a total of 14 healthcare providers across Italy were interviewed. The research is structured into four sections. The first chapter, following a brief methodological introduction, investigates the interplay between

biology and technology within the ART field. This chapter traces the historical development of ART and its relationship with the evolving nature/culture dichotomy, highlighting how it has been the progressive subject of multiple discourses, from biomedicine and biology to bioethics and bio-law. The second chapter delves into the principal sites where ART is applied, such as clinics and public healthcare facilities, examining the patterns of kinship and parenting, as well as the prevailing views on gender roles and relations that emerge in the interactions between couples and healthcare personnel. Finally, the third chapter analyses the functions and meanings attributed by health professionals to the practices and techniques they implement. The preface is written by Corinna S. Guerzoni, Professor of Anthropology at the European Institute of Design and Researcher at the Department of Cultural Heritage, Alma Mater Studiorum University of Bologna.

Formerly known as the WeWorld Index and published since 2015 by WeWorld, the Index measures the living conditions of women and children in 157 countries worldwide by assessing the implementation of their rights. The index is composed of 30 indicators grouped into 15 dimensions, which refer to 4 fundamental areas: health, education, economy and society, and the environmental and cultural context. The 2024 thematic Focus is on the "right to the future" of children and adolescents. ChildFund Alliance has developed and articulated its understanding of the right to the future as a lens for analyzing and addressing the multidimensional crises young and new generations must face. To better understand these challenges, the section includes original data and reflects the voices of 10,000 children and adolescents from 41 countries, a participatory exercise that explored their hopes, dreams, and fears about the future.

The opinion poll, conducted in partnership with Ipsos, was carried out with a representative sample of the Italian population. Enriching the data are the stories and voices of over 300 individuals who menstruate or have menstruated, sharing their personal experiences. The collection of testimonies was carried out using various qualitative research methods, including semi-structured interviews, focus groups, and personal accounts submitted to WeWorld through a social media campaign.
