Call for applications for non-EU students residing abroad

Duration: 2 years (120 ECTS)

Location: Milan, Italy

Selection: non-EU candidates residing abroad¹

Deadlines: from 18 February 2026 to 31 March 2026

¹ This call for applications does NOT concern the following categories of students, who must refer to the selection procedures for EU and equivalent citizens:

- candidates with EU citizenship, including dual citizenship (non-EU and EU), and citizens of Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway, Switzerland, the Republic of San Marino;
- non-EU candidates holding a valid Italian residence permit that allows them to enrol at a university in accordance with the regulations in force, or an EU residence permit for long-term residents;
- candidates with an Italian qualification, regardless of their nationality.

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1. Admission Requirements

- A first-level qualification lasting at least three years, equivalent to a degree, to be obtained by 31 December 2026. The suitability of the qualification is assessed by the International Admissions Office. The specific curricular and personal preparation requirements indicated in the admission requirements section must also be met.
- Knowledge of English: level B2 (CEFR) for all courses (see language requirements in the curricular requirements)
- Knowledge of Italian: level B2 (CEFR) or equivalent to be achieved by 31 July 2026.

2. Application procedure

The application must be submitted from 18 February 2026 via the online application platform for students with a foreign qualification: <https://apply.unimib.it/>

1. Register and/or log in to the portal and complete the application, making sure to fill in all the fields and upload all the necessary documents;
2. Pay the pre-enrolment fee. The fee is non-refundable;
3. Submit the application by clicking on the "Submit" button by 31 March 2026 (12:00 - Italian time).

Payment of the pre-enrolment fee and/or completion of the application does not entitle you to be considered for selection if the application has not been confirmed and submitted via the apply.unimib.it platform by the deadline.

3. Required documentation

The following documents are required to submit your application:

- Degree certificate or, for undergraduates, university enrolment certificate
- Updated transcript of records
- Identity document (passport or ID card)
- Syllabus - detailed description of the exam programmes
- English or Italian language certification (depending on the language of the course) of at least B2 level

Certificates of comparability and/or verification of the university degree issued by CIMEA will be required if further verification of the entrance qualification is deemed necessary. In this case, at least the certificate request must be sent via the apply.unimib.it platform by the deadline of 31 March 2026.

4. Admission Requirements

4.1 Marketing and Global Markets

4.1.1 Curricular requirements

Bachelor's Degree obtained in Italy and 48 credits distributed as follows:

Business area: 20 ECTS (SECS-P/07, SECS-P/08, SECS-P/09, SECS-P/10, SECS-P/11)

Economics: 12 ECTS (SECS-P/01, SECS-P/02, SECS-P/03, SECS-P/06)

Quantitative area: 10 ECTS (SECS-S/01, SECS-S/03, SECS-S/05, SECS-S/06, MAT/05, M-PSI/03, INF/01, ING-INF/05)

Law: 6 ECTS (IUS/01, IUS/02, IUS/04, IUS/05, IUS/07, IUS/08, IUS/09, IUS/10, IUS/12, IUS/13, IUS/14).

To reach 48 ECTS, the ECTS acquired as single course units or in other university study courses can also be counted. These same ECTS cannot be recognised for the purposes of achieving the 120 ECTS required for the master's degree course.

A first-level academic qualification obtained abroad and considered suitable for access to second-level degree courses in Italy. The selection committee will assess whether the requirements for admission to the master's degree course are met by evaluating the academic background abroad.

4.2 Management and Services Design

4.2.1 Curricular requirements

Bachelor's Degree obtained in Italy in the following fields of study:

L-14 Legal Services (and equivalent classes 2 and 31 pursuant to Ministerial Decree 509/99)

L-41 Statistics (and equivalent class 37 pursuant to Ministerial Decree 509/99)

L-16 Administration (and equivalent class 19 pursuant to Ministerial Decree 509/99)

L-40 Sociology (and equivalent class 36 ex Ministerial Decree 509/99)

L-39 Social Work (and equivalent class 6 pursuant to Ministerial Decree 509/99)

L-18 Business Administration (and equivalent class 17 pursuant to Ministerial Decree 509/99)

L-33 Economics (and equivalent class 28 pursuant to Ministerial Decree 509/99).

Graduate candidates in the main fields of study for the qualification listed above meet the entry curricular requirements.

Candidates who do not possess a degree in one of the main fields of study listed above may still apply, provided they possess the basic knowledge of law, sociology, economics and statistics necessary to understand the topics covered by the course.

A first-level academic qualification obtained abroad and considered suitable for access to second-level degree courses in Italy. The selection committee will assess whether the requirements for admission to the master's degree course are met by evaluating the academic background abroad.

5. Selection results and acceptance

The rankings will be published on the page by 18 May 2026.

Successful applicants must:

- 1) Obtain an entry visa and arrive in Italy no later than 31 January 2027
- 2) Send the documentation listed in the **Enrolment** paragraph via the apply.unimib.it platform
- 3) Accept the offer of admission and pay the deposit by following the instructions received through the apply.unimib.it portal.

6. Enrolment

In case of admission to the degree programme, the following documents must be submitted to complete the enrolment:

- Bachelor's degree diploma in original language with legalisation, if not previously submitted
- Translation of bachelor's degree diploma, if not already available in one of the following languages: Italian, English, French, Spanish or German
- Italian tax code
- residence permit or application for renewal of residence permit (only for legally resident non-EU applicants)
- Any additional documentation required by the University credential evaluators via the platform apply.unimib.it

The deadline for submission of the documents is 31 October 2026, subject to any impediments duly indicated by the applicant.

Once all documentation has been submitted and confirmation has been received from the offices in charge, students are required to [book an appointment](#) at the International Admissions and Credential Evaluations desk to submit the original documentation for review by 28 February 2027.

Enrolment is considered conditional until all required control procedures are completed. Failure to submit documentation, submission of qualifications unsuitable for the level of the chosen study and/or submission of false documentation will result in a report to the Head of the procedure for the adoption of appropriate disciplinary measures.

7. Warnings

The enrolment application is for all legal purposes a self-certification, within the meanings of Art. 46 of Presidential Decree 445/2000.

Candidates alone shall be responsible for the correct entry of the data required for the admission and registration procedures and are therefore required to check their accuracy. The University of Milano - Bicocca reserves the right to perform appropriate checks, including sampling checks, on statements made.

If, as a result of the checking, it emerges that untrue declarations have been made, the registration will be automatically cancelled (Art. 21-nonies of Law 241/90), without prejudice to the penalties provided for under the criminal code and statute law on the subject (Arts. 75 and 76 of Presidential Decree 445/2000).

8. Transparency

This call for applications will be published on the Official Notice Board of the University and posted to the Università degli Studi Milano-Bicocca website (www.unimib.it). The aforementioned publication shall have the value of official notice to relevant parties for all effects and consequences under the Law.

An extraordinary appeal to the President of the Republic, for defects of legitimacy only, may be lodged within 120 days, or a judicial appeal to the Regional Administrative Court, within 60 days from the date of publication on the Official Notice Board of Università degli Studi Milano-Bicocca.

9. Information on processing of personal data

Data will be processed in accordance with Legislative Decree no. 196 of 2003 (Personal Data Protection Code) and its subsequent amendments and additions, as well as EU Regulation 2016/679 (General Data Protection Regulation, the GDPR for short). 10. Final provisions
