CANDIDATES WITH ITALIAN QUALIFICATIONS

1. Entry requirements and assessment of background knowledge

Admission is conditional on the candidate's academic background. A degree in Economics or related subjects is a preferential title.

To be eligible for admission, candidates are required to hold both:

- A Bachelor's degree or equivalent qualification obtained **by December 31st 2026**
- An English language proficiency at a B2 level

Assessment of the student's academic background is based on transcript of records and any additional academic document presented by the candidate. In addition, candidates can be interviewed to complete the assessment of their academic background. Failing to attend the interview prevents admission.

1.1 Entry requirements

Admission to the Master's degree programme in International Economics is subject to the fulfilment of both of the following requirements:

- three-year degree in the fields (i.e. classi di laurea) L-18 and L-33 (according to the classification set out in Ministerial Decree 270/04) or L-17 and L-28 (according to the classification of Ministerial Decree 509/99) with a grade of no less than 110/110;
- English language proficiency at B2 level (see section 1.2).

For students who do not meet one or more of the requirements listed above, admission to the Master's degree programme is subject to the following conditions:

- holding a three-year bachelor's degree or equivalent qualification;
- holding an English language proficiency at B2 level (see section 1.2)
- passing the assessment of the candidate's knowledge and understanding in the following areas:
 - economics and business studies;
 - mathematical and statistical methods;
 - legal principles and institutions.

1.2 B2 level English language certification (Common European Framework of Reference for Languages - CEFR)

English language proficiency is considered acquired for candidates with an Italian qualification if they meet at least one of the following requirements:

- They have passed, within their university career, one or more English language exams for a total of at least 5 CFU at B2 level;
- They hold an English Language Certification of at least B2 level recognized by the University (https://www.unimib.it/sites/default/files/2026-03/Certificazioni_INGLESE_nov2025_UNIMIB_0.pdf) and obtained no more than 5 years ago;
- They hold the Bbetween Languages Open Badge – English at B2 level or higher (only for candidates from the University of Milano-Bicocca);
- They have obtained a First-level Degree (Bachelor's) delivered entirely in English;
- They hold a passport from one of the following countries: Antigua and Barbuda, Australia, Bahamas, Barbados, Belize, Canada, Dominica, Grenada, Guyana, Ireland, Jamaica, Malta, New Zealand, St Kitts and Nevis, St Lucia, St Vincent and the Grenadines, Trinidad and Tobago, United Kingdom, USA.

The requirement must be met by September 7th, 2026. Candidates with an Italian qualification who do not possess this requirement may take an in-person English language proficiency test at the University of Milano-Bicocca.

To do so, they must send a registration request for the English test to the Admission office, indicating "English test for INTECO" in the subject line and specifying the username provided for access to [Online Student Registry](#).

Graduating students of the University of Milano-Bicocca can obtain the B2 level of English proficiency by registering for the monthly language proficiency dates scheduled for their specific degree course.

Depending on the request date, the candidate will be summoned during one of the following time windows:

- June 22 to July 3, 2026 (request sent by June 16)
- September 2 to September 7, 2026 (request sent by August 26)

The automatically assigned date cannot be changed.

The test result is communicated at the end of the exam. After the test, the candidate must complete the enrolment application on [Online Student Registry](#), declaring the requirement, still within the deadline.

Please note that the dates listed above are reserved for students coming from other universities.

2. When to apply

Applications open on April 1th 2026 and close on September 7th 2026, 2.00 p.m. CET.

Admission interviews take place on:

The interview will be held online via Google Meet.

Candidates are assigned by the Online Student Registry a date and time for the interview. The candidate will receive the Google Meet invitation a few minutes before the scheduled time. The invitation will be sent to the email address reported by the candidate in the application form. At the end of the application procedure, please print your admission request: it reports the interview appointment.

If unable to attend at the assigned date and time, please write to inteco@unimib.it (Mail subject: interview) to re-schedule your interview.

3. How to apply

The application for admission must be presented online at the website of the University of Milano-Bicocca Online Student Registry.

Applicants must register if they access the [Online Student Registry](#) for the first time (selecting “Registration”). Applicants can register only once.

To register, candidates must provide the following information:

- Tax code;
- Personal data;
- Residence and domicile;
- Telephone, mobile phone and email.

Following completion of required information, the applicants will be given a username and a password using which they can login for the application.

Now, from Online Student Registry candidates must log in (clicking MENU on top-right of the page and then “login”).

From MENU select “home”, then “Evaluation Test”, “Enrollment in an evaluation test”, “2-year Master Degree”, “INTERNATIONAL ECONOMICS: Call for application”.

During the application process, applicants are required to enter the following documents:

- Upload valid ID document (Identity card or passport);
- ID photo in digital format (bitmap or jpeg) with a resolution of at least 300x400 pixel;
- Upload their self-certification of degree certificate or, for students near graduation, a self-certification of university enrolment certificate
